Junior and Senior School Production

In past years we have had a combined whole school production, but this year we have split it in two. The junior and senior school performing tonight and the middle and Bilingual will be having theirs next term. The idea behind this is to make sure our students all get a really good opportunity to do the learning associated with a school production and to let more of them 'shine'.

Road Safety

Firstly.....THANK YOU! Nearly everyone I see is doing a good job of ensuring our students safety around the school by parking appropriately and being considerate. I understand we will have some flashing 'school zone' signs up in the next week or two. The new drop off area is

being used more appropriately each day and I have had some great feedback about it. We will hopefully get the gardens etc started in the next few weeks.

Most of our students respect the road rules and cross safely, looking for cars etc. However, we have a small group who are risking their lives by doing a few dangerous things on our roads. Please, do have a chat with your own children and ensure they understand the implications of a serious injury or worse. Also, if you see any of our students (or any other people for that matter) doing dangerous or silly things on or around our roads, stop and say something to them. If we all send the same messages, there is a good chance people take notice.

Police vetting

Reminder that police checks have been free for us in the past but as of the 11 July 2017 we will need to pay \$9.80 per request. Given that we do the checks every 2-3 years, this means if we were to police check a third of our school whanau each year, that is an extra \$1400 a year we need to find! We have no intention of passing this extra cost on to our community but would really appreciate anyone not checked this year, getting a new form in in the next few weeks so we won't need to do them again for 2-3 years:).
