We have named our enrolment and school visits programme our preschool buddy programme. The term buddies are what we wish our 5-year-old to feel when starting school- relax, happy, feel comfortable and know their way around a little bit. Plus, adding in a big buddy to look after them whilst in their first year at school. A big buddy for the little buddy!

This brochure aims to inform you and sets out what you can expect as your child transitions from pre-school into our learning hubs at Kawaha Point School.






We think that time is one of the most important parts of transitioning to school. We recommend starting visits 6 weeks to 1 month before your child starts school to help with the transition.

We are very flexible with times and days and will meet you and your child's needs. Children would typically begin visiting once a week for morning or afternoon sessions as we build up to the starting date.

We will create a school visits plan with you that fits in with your routine. You don't need to stick with our Tuesday's afternoons. Once you have made up your mind on which 5 year old class you would like your child to start in, we will set a plan in place around your needs and times.

We will contact you around 6 weeks before your child is due to turn 5 and start planning visits and enrolment!

You will also need time to arrange stationery and uniform (we have second hand uniform at school or else see the Uniform shop in town- hats are sold at school





At KPS, we aim to keep our school community well informed. When you have completed your enrolment form, we will send our **school newsletter** to your email address to keep you up to date with all school events, activities and news.

Our **school website** <u>www.kawaha-point.school.nz</u> has all the information that you will need about the school, including enrolment.


We have a Kawaha Point School **Facebook page**, which you can become a member of, to get information, ask questions, see photos and join conversations.

We have parent's evening each term where you can come and talk with the class teacher about your child's progress.

There are also numerous family and school events throughout the year which you are invited to!

Kawaha Point school has an open door policy so you can come and see us whenever it suits you – whether it's for a chat, a coffee or to pop into your child's classroom – you are always welcome!

As your child is visiting school, we are there to answer questions and give support.







How do we organise enrolments?

First you can complete an **enrolment form**! There is one attached to this brochure, you can complete and submit one on the school website or you can pop out to school and pick one up from the office. You will need to provide a copy of your child's full birth certificate and immunisations with your enrolment form.

Once you have completed the enrolment form, we will keep you informed of the school's events via our newsletter. Six weeks before your child turns 5, we will contact you to set up a visiting plan for the class you wish your child to start in.

We can also assist with organising uniform and stationery with you.



One of the most important reasons for transitioning to school over time is for the children to become used to the routines and structures in place at school. New students who have been through a series of school visits are able to settle into their class more easily as they are aware of our daily routines and expectations.

In our 5-year-old classes (there are 2 options to choose from. They are English medium and Te Ao Maori Focus- children are given instructions in both Te Reo and English. We have a balanced learning programme that includes opportunities for short breaks and free choosing of activities throughout the day's learning.

During visits, the children will not only learn how the school day is structured but begin to familiarise themselves with expectations for mat time, moving around the school, playtimes, lunchtimes, toileting and our KPS Values. Visiting students will be buddied with a classmate to help them and learn alongside them. Our Space 3 students are also buddies with a senior student from Karearea Hub (our Year 5 and 6 students) who will act as a role model, friend and learning buddy for their first year of school.

In Kai Manga Reo, the teachers will make sure an older child (Tuakana) is paired with your child (Teina).



When your child arrives in their chosen Class for their visits they will need to bring a few things! Children should bring their school bag; there will be a labeled coat peg waiting for them to hang their bag on. Children should bring morning tea if they are visiting in the morning and lunch if they are staying for lunchtime. A sun hat is also recommended.

Once your child has a school uniform, they should wear this when they visit! There is a stationery list for their Class, which includes all of the books and equipment needed. This will be free.

All of the children have book-bags to take home their reading books, school notices, homework and school library books. We can provide a book-bag free of charge...but you may wish to purchase your child their own one! We encourage parents and carers to stay while children are settling in – you are more than welcome to stay in the classroom and use our community coffee spot to relax with a drink!



We would encourage you to talk to your child about starting school. Talking about the move to school in a positive way can really help ease any worries that the children may have! Talking about what to expect, the days and times they are visiting, who they might know at school, the bus journeys, the school playgrounds, playtimes and lunchtimes are all good ideas. Your child's teacher or our DP, will also come to visit them at their early childhood setting twice a term to start building to start building those important relationships!
