Curriculum News

Target writing at KPS

This year, we are placing a strong focus on writing in Years 3-6. Data from last year highlighted the need to close the gaps in writing achievement compared to our reading and maths results. To address this, the senior leadership team, in collaboration with teachers and learning assistants, has developed a targeted writing programme aimed at accelerating progress for our writers who are below curriculum expectations.

Our dedicated learning assistants are working closely with these students, providing small-group instruction as well as in-class support. During target writing sessions, children focus on:

- High-frequency words (heart words) recognising, reading, and spelling them with confidence.
- Writing fluency developing ease and automaticity in their writing.
- Letter formation ensuring correct and consistent handwriting.
- Editing and punctuation strengthening their ability to revise and refine their writing.

We believe this targeted approach will support our writers in making meaningful progress. Parents will have the opportunity to discuss the target writing programme during parent interviews, especially if their child is part of the initiative.

It is our shared responsibility and is very important that school and whanau work together to support attendance. The Ministry of Education (MOE) is responsible for services and initiatives designed to support schools to monitor and improve attendance. Schools and kura must have attendance policies and procedures, and they must record and report on attendance.


Whānau - parents and caregivers must make sure their children are at school every day, and let the school know on the day if they're absent. If you do not let us know the reason for your child's absence it is recorded as **UNJUSTIFIED.**

The current guidelines also state that for more than 5 days of **UNJUSTIFIED** absence the school is responsible to inform whanau and offer support and take action.

Under MOE guidelines, family holidays, birthdays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are NOT acceptable reasons for being absent. These absences will be recorded as **UNJUSTIFIED**. Please let us know when your child is going to be away. **MRS H.**
