- Classroom Upgrades: We're pleased to share that heat pumps have been installed in all classrooms, including the library. This has made a big difference in keeping learning spaces cool and comfortable this term.
- **Property Focus:** Our next major project is replacing the roofing on the main block, which is scheduled to happen during the next school holidays.
- International Student Programme: The Board is exploring the possibility of becoming an international school and will be conducting further research into this exciting opportunity.
- OSCAR Afterschool Care: The first stage of OSCAR approval has gone well, and we are now waiting for the final sign-off to ensure we meet all their standards. 

#### How I became dame.

On the 14th of September . I, Whina Cooper, started a protest hikoi from Te Hupua to Wellington to stop the pakeha from stealing our land. I am 79 years old and I am determined.

As I walked 50 lovely people joined me on this long quest. As we walked people could hear us chanting and saying "NOT ONE more ACre OF MAORI LAND!" We were furious and determinde to stop pakeha from stealing our land! We were walking from Te Hapua to Wellington.

The hot sun burned us as we marched through the town. Our feet ached with blisters and as soon as I was about to fall a wonderful pakeha nurse helped us with our blisters. While she was wrapping the band aid around my fool my heart was warmed by her kindness and gentleness as she helped us one by one by one. We were finally ready to get back on the road.

The day before parliament steps.
As we walked 5000 people joined us. Our throats hurt as we proudly
shouldd "NOTONE MORE Acre OF MAORI LAND!" As we walked
through the town, a kind man invited us into his marae for kai and
some beds to steep on. The nevt day we thanked them for all their help.
As we packed up they gave us new shoes to walk in, and now we are
ready to keep on moving.

Today is the day. As I stepped on to parliament steps I was furious because pakeha was taking our land, but with 60,000 signatures on our petition they had no right to take Maori land. As I left I was relieved and finally we could relax in peace. Years later I was knighted by the queen and became dame. I was honored and I would fight for my people again.


