Headlines from Mrs H ATTENDANCE - EVERY DAY COUNTS



It is our shared responsibility and is very important that school and whanau work together to support attendance. The **Ministry of Education (MOE)** is responsible for services and initiatives designed to support schools to monitor and improve attendance. Schools and kura must have attendance policies and procedures, and they must record and report on attendance.

Whānau - parents and caregivers must make sure their children are at school every day, and let the school know on the day if they're absent. If you do not let us know the reason for your child's absence it is recorded as UNJUSTIFIED.

Days missed = years lost A day here and there doesn't seem like much, but		
When you child misses just 	they miss	and
l day a fortnight =	4 weeks per year =	1 year over their school life
1 day a week =	8 weeks per year =	2.5 years over their school life

The current guidelines also state that for more than 5 days of **UNJUSTIFIED** absence the school is responsible to inform whanau and offer support and take action.

Under MOE guidelines, family holidays, birthdays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are **NOT** acceptable reasons for being absent. These absences will be recorded as **UNJUSTIFIED**.

Please let us know when your child is going to be away from school and the reason.

You can do this by:

- Calling the office on 073485864 and leave a message on the answerphone or with our office administrators.
- Connect to the HERO app and leave a note of absence.
- Let your child's class teacher know they will be absent. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask
