
Ki te Taumata Aim for the Best

Principal's Pen



This week, I was contacted by a reporter from the Bay of Plenty Times, asking for my thoughts on the government's recent announcement on a shift from open-plan to singlecell classrooms.

At Kawaha Point School, we made this move three years ago. When I first arrived, we had large hubs of 60-90 children — and it was clear that this model didn't align with the direction we wanted to take as a school. Achievement levels were low, behaviour was a challenge, and many children didn't see themselves as successful learners.

Moving to single-cell classrooms was a big shift, but it's one that has made a huge difference. Since then, we've seen improvements across the board — in achievement, behaviour, and learner confidence. Our students are more engaged, focused, and proud of their learning.

Another key change the Board made was to reintroduce furniture into classrooms. In openplan spaces, there was often very little furniture and not enough places for children to sit, write, or work effectively. Over the past three years, the Board has invested heavily to return our school to a space that truly supports learning.

We still collaborate, we still connect across classrooms — but the core focus is clear: learning comes first.

If you're passionate about supporting the direction of our kura and want to be involved in important decisions that shape our future, Board of Trustee elections are happening this term. We would love for you to consider standing.

ATTENDANCE - EVERY DAY COUNTS ATTENDANCE Term 3



Attendance is a shared responsibility.

Today's learners are tomorrow's leaders.

Attendance is the first step to learning. Students aged 6-16 years old are legally required to attend school every day. It's everyone's responsibility to make sure children and young people attend so they can engage and achieve in their learning. Schools are expected to have their own attendance policies and procedures, and they must record and report on attendance. This includes a responsibility to take reasonable steps to make sure enrolled students attend whenever the school is open.

You MUST let us know EVERYDAY your child is away from school. You can do this by

- Calling the office on 073485864 and leave a message on the answerphone or with our office administrators.
- Connect to the HERO app and leave a note of absence.
- Let your child's class teacher know they will be absent. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask.
